Council Chair Carlton Weeks called the third meeting of the 2011-2012 North Carolina Lions State Council of Governors to order at 9:00 AM.

District Governor Denning Buchter led the Pledge of Allegiance and District Governor Jim Boehm gave the invocation.

For the record, the Council held a Workshop on Friday evening, February 10, 2012. All eight District Governors were present at the Workshop and seven at today's State Council Meeting.

CC Weeks welcomed all to the third State Council Meeting of the 2011-2012 Lions Year.

Governor Lilliston moved to accept the Agenda for today's meeting; seconded by Governor Champion. The motion passed. (See Attachment A)

CC Weeks recognized PID Dr. Lacy Presnell for comments to which he replied, "Happy to be here and for crossing paths with you."

CC Weeks then recognized PCC Harvey Whitley who thanked those who have been supportive to both he and Diane over the past several months especially those districts that held Silent Auctions to raise funds for his candidacy for International Director. He noted that his certification of endorsement from the State has been accepted and cleared by the Legal Department of LCI and is in the hands of the Nominating Committee. He then passed around a legal pad on which he asked those who were going to Korea to list their name, phone number, and email address. He said that he would need their help from them with his candidacy when they arrived at the International Convention.

CC Weeks then commented that the tickets for the international breakfast in Korea were yet to be received and that he would let everyone, who was going, know when they were available for distribution.

There were no communications.

PCC Carlton Metts agreed to serve as Parliamentarian.

Governor Champion moved to accept the Minutes of the November 12, 2011, State Council Meeting as distributed to all District Governors by email and as posted on the website; seconded by Governor Sutton. The motion passed.

State Council Secretary-Treasurer Kelly presented the State Council Financial Report dated 02/06/12. He stated that the ledger and bank account had been reconciled and that all bills had been paid. He then reviewed pertinent income and expense line items and then proceeded to review the Money Market Account. He concluded his report by stating that the checking account balance stood at \$21,717.77, and the Council Money Market balance was \$79,160.73. Total assets, therefore, were \$100,878.53. Governor Lilliston moved to accept the Financial Report; seconded by Governor Schwartz. The motion passed. (See Attachment B)

CC Weeks recognized PCC Ron Staley for his report on the status of the 2012 Lions State Convention to be held at the Marriott Executive Park Hotel in Charlotte on May 17-20, 2012. He started his report by saying how excited he was to have the State Convention in Charlotte and that plans are well on their way in District 31-E to host this event. All of the meeting rooms in the Hotel will be for the NC Lions use only during our stay, he said. He encouraged the Governors to go back to their Districts and talk-up how great this convention will be and to suggest to their members to get their registration forms in early. Vendor tables have been priced at \$100 for non-lion exhibitors. He noted that he will need pictures from the District Governors, the DGE's, 1stVDGE's, and the 2nd VDGE's by April 1st. He told the 1stVDGE's that they will host the Hospitality Room and will be able to bring in food. He will need each to pay him \$200 as has been done in the past. He has arranged for the food, he said, as well as lining up people to host the event for them. In closing he said that the Host Committee has designed a special pin in a NASCAR Racing motif that will be sold for \$4.00 to raise additional funds for the State Convention. (See Attachment C)

CC Weeks recognized PDG Paul Bledsoe who would be giving State Convention Committee Chair Harriett Edmunds' report in her absence. Lion Paul reported that the 2013 NC Lions Annual State Convention will be held at the Marriott Hotel at the Greensboro Airport. The keynote speaker for the convention, he said, will be the then 1st International Vice President Barry Palmer (and his wife Anne) from Australia. He went on to report that he and PDG Bill Womack would head up the Host Committee. He noted from Lion Harriett's report that Council Chair Carlton Weeks has offered the suggestion that the State Convention Committee look into scheduling the state conventions on the same weekend every year. In concluding Lion Harriett's report he noted her request that the 1st

Vice District Governors confer on hosting the 2014 NC Lions State Convention.

Council Chair Weeks recognized North Carolina Lions, Inc. President, Stewart Wooten for his report. Lion Stewart's report centered on the events that were going on at Camp Dogwood; the extensive roof repairs and the replacement of the carpet in the lodge, volunteer week, the off season, and the Summer camp staff.

Council Chair Weeks recognized MD Global Leadership Coordinator PCC Ron Staley for his report. Lion Ron reported that since the last meeting there has been a change in one of the District Coordinators; District J appointed PDG Mike Flora to replace Ron Daniels who resigned. Lion Ron noted that we currently have 102 Certified Guiding Lions in North Carolina and he urged the District Governors to utilize their services to organize new clubs. At least two should be certified and in place prior to organizing a new club, he said. He concluded his remarks by noting that he has asked the District GLT's to find clubs interested in participating in the Club Excellence Process. He said that this was an excellent program for members and leaders in finding new ways to serve their communities, explore mutual interests, as well as, giving members the opportunity to take ownership of the clubs activities. Council Chair Weeks announced that PCC Gary Greene, our MD Global Membership Coordinator made his presentation to the Council of Governors at the Friday Night Workshop.

Lion Gary stated, at the workshop, that if you would like to become involved with membership growth, our GMT Program comes down to three (3) components: (a) strengthen our existing Clubs by asking them to undergo the Club Excellence Program, (b) rebuild our Clubs with less than 15 members to 20 or more members and, (c) build at least two (2) New Strong Lions Clubs in each and every district. He closed his remarks by saying that if you have an idea for an event, service project, or other way to draw positive attention to North Carolina Lions; he'd love to hear it.

Reports of Statewide Committee Chairs:

Boys & Girls Homes of North Carolina: PDG Theresa Matthews announced that "Clean up Day" at Boys & Girls Homes of NC at Lake Waccamaw is April 14th. She noted that Projects would be available from 8:30 AM to 4:00 PM with lunch served around noon. She also said that she would like for Clubs to consider "Christmas in July" for the kids, i.e. donations of summer supplies, school supplies, toiletries, gift cards, games, sports equipment. Outings, she said are needed all year long. (See attachment G)

<u>Campus Clubs/Leos/Youth Exchange:</u> Lion Liz Steele reported that while Campus Club activity was still going strong there was very little activity in Youth Exchange. Allot is going on in Leo's with two (2) new Clubs formed this year. The Leo Convention scheduled for February 24/25/26^{th.}, at Camp Dogwood was lagging in registrations, she said, with only 18/19 registered turned in so far. She concluded her report by inviting both the District Governors and the 1st Vice District Governors to attend some or

all of the Convention. She especially would like them to come for the "Stop Hunger Now Project that will be held on Sunday morning.

<u>Celebrate Liberty:</u> PDG Mike Covell began his report by reiterating the three goals his committee has established for the Lions year 2011- 2012. He reported that Districts 31A, 31F and 31G are participating in the Statewide Celebrate Liberty Day Contest and that District 31E's Celebrate Liberty Chairpersons, Sarah and Braxton Troublefield will be coordinating the awards ceremony. In closing he noted that the Celebrate Liberty commemorative pin for 2012-2013 will honor James Madison, the father of our Constitution. (See attachment H)

Constitution & By-Laws: PDG Charles Holliman presented the revised "North Carolina Lions Hall of Fame" Policy to be approved at this meeting. He noted that these new changes were presented at the last Council of Governors meeting on November 12, 2011. He reported that the NCL, Inc.'s Committee to Study Committees recommended that the 21st Century Vision Van and LEHP Committee be eliminated. Further, the Committee recommended that the LEHP duties and responsibilities be placed under the Council of Governor's Committee for Diabetes Awareness.

Governor Schwartz moved that the Council accept the changes to our Policy & Procedures

Manual with regard to the number chosen for induction each year to our North Carolina Lions

Hall of Fame. The Policy will now read: "From the nominations submitted, the Council of

Governors will select up to four (4) living and up to four (4) deceased Lions for induction into the

North Carolina Lions Hall of Fame"; seconded by Governor Champion. The motion passed.

Committee Chair Holliman then brought up the fact while LCI, since March 1984, has made Diabetes Awareness a major commitment, our MD-31 Constitution does not mention this initiative among its list of approved committees. After a brief discussion, <u>Governor Boehm made the motion that a Diabetes Awareness and LEHP Committee be constituted under the Council of Governors; seconded by Governor Lilliston. The motion passed. This motion was then modified by Governor Lilliston; seconded by Governor Denning to eliminate the word LEHP from the title, making the title, the Diabetes Awareness Committee. The modified motion passed.</u>

<u>Diabetes Awareness:</u> Lion Bill Barnwell began his presentation by saying that diabetes statistics are not improving. As of 2011, he said, 8.3% or 25.8 million children and adults in the US have diabetes. After going through some grim complications caused by diabetes he challenged us to join the Lions of the world in the fight to stop diabetes. (See attachment J)

<u>Historian:</u> Lion Valerie Carpenter stated that the timetable for the History Book remains as discussed at the November meeting. She noted that the Fourth Section containing Club histories and photos has a final deadline in March. (See attachment K)

<u>Information Technology: PDG Paul Bledsoe_announced that we have received the final phase of the \$10K PR Grant. He noted that with the Governors input he will update and purchase non-profit</u>

billboards in the coastal and eastern part of the state. The Governors, he said, had a \$1,750 matching grant available if they wanted to apply for it. (See attachment L)

Lions Alert: PDG Dale Dupree commented on the lack of activity. He is contemplating holding a workshop at Camp Dogwood regarding the future of his committee. In the meantime he is investigating joining VOAD (Voluntary Organizations Active in a Disaster).

MD LCIF Coordinator: PCC Harvey Whitley began his report by reminding us that LCIF continues to deliver miracles through grants all over the world. Here in North Carolina, he said, we have experienced recent aid through Emergency Disaster Grants for tornados and hurricanes. The balance of his report centered on the challenge LCIF received in October 2011, from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. This initiative, called "One Shot, One Life: The Lions Measles Initiative," seeks to raise \$10 million, with a \$5 million commitment from the Gates Foundation if we do, to go towards eradication a devastating disease that kills some 164,000 people, mostly children every year. Lion Harvey said we needed to make a personal commitment to Measles and requested our participation. (See attachment M)

Nominations: PDG Bob Sprinkle distributed and discussed the list the Districts have submitted announcing their District Governor-Elect, 1st Vice District Governor-Elect, and 2nd Vice District (See attachment N) Governor-Elect.

Promotions: PDG Gary Steele deferred his report until the Promotions Committee Meeting.

Research & Long-Range Planning: PDG John T. Miller, III, was unable to attend.

A motion was made by Governor Hopkins to accept the Committee Reports as reported; seconded by Governor Champion. The motion passed.

Unfinished Business: PCC Ron Staley reported that Wells Fargo Bank, which acquired Wachovia Bank, has printed; free of charge, 3000 copies of the Celebrate Liberty booklets.

New Business: None.

Their being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:38 AM.



- We currently have 102 Certified Guiding Lions in the North Carolina. I sent a list to you and your District Leadership and Membership coordinators in January. There is also a list of current CGLs attached to your copy of this report. There are other Lions in process of becoming certified. They are ready to assist with your efforts to organize new clubs. Contact your GLT and they will assist if others are needed. Certification can be done using the training materials available online. Your District GLTs have access to this material and can make it available to any Lion in your District wishing to get certified. I don't how much easier that could be. It doesn't involve scheduling lengthy training sessions or the cost of travel, meals and lodging. All we have to do is spend the time to read the materials complete the exercises, take a test and send it to your District GLC or you. At least two should be certified and in place prior to organizing a new club and we need many more so we can plan future growth in our districts.
- I am asking your GLTs to find clubs interested in participating in the Club Excellence Process. Again there has been online training for your District GLT Coordinators and the materials are available online. This is an excellent program regardless of the size or strength of the club. It will assist members and leaders in finding new ways to serve their communities, explore mutual interests, as well as, giving members the opportunity to take ownership of the clubs activities. I feel this process can strengthen and energize our members and our clubs. I have seen similar processes work in businesses and it is a good program.

Utilize current resources from official diabetes associations to become knowledgeable about diabetes and diabetic retinopathy.

Visit clubs. Encourage them to appoint a club diabetes awareness chairperson

Promote club awareness of the opportunity to earn the annual "New Horizon: In Diabetes Education" award..

Partner with local diabetes associations and health care professionals

Take the lead in planning and facilitating diabetes awareness presentations for forums, zone meetings, district and multiple district conventions.

Stress to clubs the importance of helping educate the public about diabetic retinopathy and action steps needed to reduce the new cases of blindness caused by diabetic retinopathy.

Encourage clubs to carry out joint diabetes screening projects with other health care organizations, as well as combining a test for diabetic retinopathy with glaucoma testing whenever such activity is undertaken.

Encourage clubs to participate in the following diabetes-related events: Diabetes Awareness Month (November), World Diabetes Day (November 14) and World Sight Day (second Thursday in October).

"North Carolina Lions Hall of Fame"

Purpose: The mission of the North Carolina Lions Hall of Fame is: "to honor, in perpetuity, those Lions whose contributions to Lionism in North Carolina are of great value."

Criteria: Nominees may be living or deceased. Their contribution(s) should be of enduring value and of major importance in furthering the goals of Lionism in North Carolina.

Who Decides: The Council of Governors

Nominations/Number Chosen: Any District may nominate and submit a resume for one (1) living and one (1) deceased Lion each year. From the nominations submitted, the Council of Governors will select up to four (4) living and up to four (4) deceased Lions for induction into the North Carolina Lions Hall of Fame. Submissions should include pertinent information as outlined on the attached Nominations Form. The deadline for submission to the respective District Governor is January 31st so that State Council may decide on the inductees at their February meeting.

Induction: Honorees will be inducted or posthumously announced at the District Governor's Banquet during the N.C. Lion's State Convention. For the living nominee, the presentation will be made by the recipient of last year's award who will be assisted by the Council Chair and the recipient's District Governor. For the deceased nominee, the presentation will be made by the Council Chair and the appropriate District Governor to the family of the nominee (if present). If the family is not present, the District Governor will be responsible for making the presentation to the family at the appropriate time and place.

Display of Honorees: Each Recipient's name and year of Induction will be shown at Camp Dogwood in an appropriate location. Honoree's name and year may be shown on the North Carolina Lion's website.

Diabetes Awareness

Good Moring, Governors and Fellow Lions,

Diabetes statistics are not improving, We are on ski slope, health wise with no end in sight.

As of 2011, 25.8 million children and adults in the US have diabetes, about 8.3 percent of the population. There are also 79 million adults with pre-diabetes. In 2010 alone, 1.9 million new cases were diagnosed in the 20 year and older population. The older population, those 65 and older, 26.9 percent of all the people in this group have diabetes.

The complications caused by diabetes are:

- a) Heart disease and stroke
- b) High blood pressure-67 percent of the adults with diabetes had a blood pressure greater than 140/90
- c) Blindness
- d) Kidney disease In 2008, 202,290 diabetics were living on chronic dialysis
- e) Nervous system disease
- f) Amputation-In 2006, 65,700 diabetics had lower

limb amputations

As to mortality, in 2007, the latest figures available, 71,382 death certificates listed diabetes as the underlying cause of death and as contributing factor in 160,022 death certificates. That is a total of 231,404 deaths caused by diabetes.

The cost of diabetes increase each day, again using 2007 figures, the total cost of diabetes was \$218 billion. Thing we do not realize was the cost of undiagnosed diabetes was \$18 billion and pre-diabetes was \$25 billion.

Report to the MD 31 Council of Governors

Charlotte, NC February 11, 2012

LCIF continues to deliver miracles through grants all over the world. Here in North Carolina, we have experienced recent aid through Emergency Grants for tornados and hurricanes. Soon we will be requesting assistance from LCIF through a matching funds request to assist us in providing a new Vision Van.

Worldwide, we are working on a measles vaccination program, which you have been reading about in the LION magazine.

Each day, 450 children die around the world because of complications from contracting measles. Every year, 164,000 people, mostly children, die from this disease. Approximately 30% of measles victims suffer from a variety of complications, including brain-swelling, blindness and pneumonia. With the help of Lions and Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF), these children can live and lead full, productive lives.

In October, 2011, Lions received a challenge from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. If LCIF is able to raise US\$10 million by June 30, 2012, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation will match that amount with an additional US\$5 million. This means that for every two dollars raised by Lions, the Gates Foundation will donate an additional dollar. Under the name "One Shot, One Life: The Lions Measles Initiative," Lions everywhere are responding to this challenge

For an average cost of US\$1, a child can receive a potentially life-saving vaccination against measles. With the help of our partners in the Measles Initiative (led by the World Health Organization, UNICEF, United Nations Foundation, U.S. Centers for Disease Control, and the American Red Cross) we can save these children and make great strides toward eradicating a devastating disease. All donations to the Lions Measles Initiative are eligible for Melvin Jones Fellowship (MJF) credit.

LCIF Chairperson, Former International President Sid Scruggs has asked us, as Lions leaders, to do three things to promote this measles initiative:

- 1. Make a Commitment to Measles This commitment should be personal and an exciting use of your talent and time.
- 2. Educate Lions and Promote the Initiative Prioritize the clubs and events in your area and begin conducting presentations.
- 3. Request Participation and Follow Up Provide each club and member the opportunity to participate in this important program. Answer questions, Thank donors and clubs.
