This has been confirmed by our on GST, PID Harvey, and by David Lloyd, our area GAT leader. Hopefully, those technical issues are now solved. As of this morning, we have a +13 in membership. On the service side, we now show that we have served 16,898 people with Districts O and I leading the way. We will hear more about these plus a few other things tomorrow.

I have a few items I would like to bring your attention to as we go through the balance sheet.

Line item 3000 and 3001:

Brighter Visions and Memorials:

Budget \$ 530,000

Actual \$527,167

This is \$ 2,833 behind budget. Great job.

Camp-Line Items 3200-3299

Actual - \$ 302,907

Budget - \$ 308,500

Difference of -\$5,593 Once again great job.

Camp raffle – Line item 3500

Actual - \$ 112,690

Budget - \$ 120,000

Difference - \$ 7,310

Cost - \$ 27,957

Profit - \$ 84,733

This should answer any questions on our car raffle. Great job.

Walking canes – As has been all year, ended the year significantly below budget. \$ 15,234

Vision Van:

Line Item – 4077-4084

Actual - \$ 38,671

Budget - \$ 36,804

\$ 1,867 above budget

This is even after significant repairs and unforeseen expenses. A big thank you to Bryan for the great job he does.

Camp Dogwood overall expenses – Line Items 4105-4181

Actual Expense - \$ 613,484

Budget Expense - \$ 574,199

Difference of \$ 39,285

Compared to what we anticipated this is great. Payroll and employee expense being a big part of this difference.

Matching Funds – Line Item 4202

Actual - \$ 61633

Budget - \$ 65,000

Difference - \$ 3,367

We anticipated running out of funds by April. I don't think we did not help anyone that requested.

Officers and Committees Line Item 4230 – 4247

Actual – 14,892

Budget - \$ 19,000

Difference - \$ 4,108

We cut this line item significantly last year in budget meetings. It shows what we as officers can do to help. Thank ourselves.

Office Expense – Line Items 4300-4380

Actual - \$ 80,954

Budget - \$ 71,475

Difference - \$ 9,479

This is primarily for line item 4340, software repair and line item 4388, investment fees.

Maintenance – Line items 4600-4619

Actual - \$ 124,324

Budget - \$ 116,200

Difference - \$ 8,124

This is mostly because of water waste and the dryer we had to purchase.

All and all I think we had a very successful year even in the down financial crisis this country and most of our clubs are in.

My next report should be after the auditors are finished with there audit. It will reflect their findings and recommendations.

Clinical Research is an ongoing project and covers many areas of eye research and related fields. Areas that have on going research are Glaucoma, Cataracts, eyes with Corneal Abnormality, dry eye diseases, inherited eye diseases and many more. In North Carolina we continue to have three major research organizations, Duke University, Wake Forest University and UNC Kitterner Eye Center that carry on this research. However we do have other medical Organizations within our state that do clinical eye research and they work closely with each other. Some of these organizations are Charlotte Eye, Ear, Nose, and Throat Associates, Cornerstone Health Care in High Point, Mundorf Eye Canter Charlotte, Physicians Protocol in Greensboro, and The National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences located in the Research Triangle Park. We will continue to stay in contact with these organizations and bring to you what we learn And what support they may need from us.

EVEN WITH ALL THESE CHALLENGE, WE HAD A SUCCESSFUL CAMPING SEASON.

NOW IT IS TIME TO FACE THIS LION YEAR. AGAIN, AGE IS STILL OUR OPPONENT. THE AIR CONDITIONER IN DUPLEX 4 AND IN WHITE NEED TO BE REPLACED. THE A/C COMPRESSOR IN THE REC CENTER IS ON IT'S LAST LEG. AND THE NEED REMAINS FOR ANOTHER A/C UNIT IN THE CATES ROOM. AND, BASED ON PROFESSIONAL ADVISE, THE A/C UNITS IN LINEBERGER AND UDOVICH WERE INSTALLED INCORRECTLY. ALL OF THEM SHOULD HAVE BUILT WITH A SLANT SO THE CONDENCED MOISTURE COULD DRAIN OUT. AS THEY ARE NOW, THE WATER DOES NOT DRAIN OFF AND THIS IS CAUSING THE BOARDS AROUND THE UNIT TO ROT. YOU CAN SEE THE RESULTS, THERE IS USUALLY A STAIN STREAK ON THE OUTSIDE WALLS.

THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT MADE IT'S ANNUAL INSPECTION LAST WEEK AND WE WERE DINGED FOR THE CARPETS IN LINEBRGER AND UDOVICH BEDROOMS BECAUSE OF STAINED AND BUBBLING. BUBBLING CARPETS ARE A HEALTH HAZARD AND NEED TO BE REPLACED BEFORE SOMEONE FALLS. DUPLEX1 HAS A STAINED CARPET THAT MIGHT BE CLEANED. IF NOT, IT WOULD HAVE TO BE REPLACED. DUPLEX 3 BATHROOM NEEDS TO BE RETILED OR REPLACED. THERE WERE A FEW AREAS THAT NEED TO BE PAINTED BUT LION TAMMY IS CONFIDENT THAT HER MAINTENANCE CREW CAN HANDLE THAT. IF NOT, IT WOULD BE A CLEAN-UP WEEK CHORE.

ON TOP OF ALL THAT, THE WELL LOCATED BESIDE THE MSU BUILDING HAS TO BE REPLUMBED. THE JOINTS AND VALVES ARE CORRODED AND MUST BE REPLACED. THESE PROBLEMS WERE FOUND WHEN THE PLUMBER WAS PREPARING TO FIX THE ON-GOING LEAK AT THE REC CENTER. THE PIPES FROM THE WELL TO THE REC CENTER, AND MAYBE TO OTHER AREAS OF CAMP, ARE BLACK ROLLED PIPE THAT WAS USED 20-30 YEARS AGO. WITH AGE, THE PIPING BECOMES BRITTLE AND CANNOT BE REPAIRED. THE PLUMBER SAID THAT ONCE THE LINE STARTES GETTING PIN HOLES, IT IS BEST TO REPLACE ALL OF IT.

THERE IS ONE JOB THAT NEED TO BE COMPLETED BY PROFESSIONAL, THAT IS TO FINISH CLEANING OUT THE GUTTERS. THE MAINTENANCE STAFF CANNOT PERFORM THIS JOB DUE TO LACK OF EQUIPMENT.

THIS IS A REPORT OF THE CURRENT CIRCUMSTANCES AT CAMP DOGWOOD.



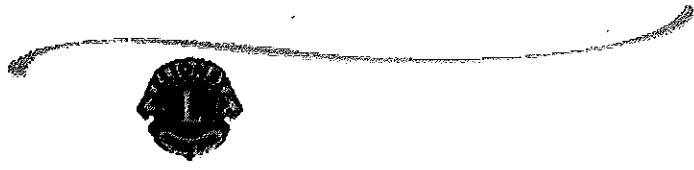
Camping season totaled about 515 this season down from 550 last year. We did have a large group that cancelled week 2 and thus causing the decrease in numbers.

Fellowships and Partners

Members of the Board of NCLI and attendees,

Thank you for allowing me to serve as your State Committee Chair for Fellowships and partners.

As District Treasurer for 31-S I would like to thank Durdeen Dean and his excellent staff for the promptness with which they fulfilled my requests for NCLI Awards this past May and June. They really applied themselves and returned my awards quickly and even corrected my errors (2) in ordering the incorrect level of the awards.

Attached are reports as available from NCLI online. I would note that in the case of District 31-S the Fellowships and Partners Monetary report dated June 30, 2019 is not up to date and appears to be missing the 2 NCLI Ambassadors plus my second order of 4 Woolards and 2 Scruggs and 1 NCLI Ambassador. Apparently the report does not cover the NCLI Ambassador Award.

Obviously the 45 page report of individual members awards dated February 2019 which I did not reprint is not current also. Also this report does not include the NCLI Ambassador Award.

I would like to call your attention to the **Membership Certificate Request** which is available to award to anyone:

Sustaining Membership	\$50-\$99
Patron Membership	\$100-\$199
Life Membership	\$200 +

I would next like to call your attention to the **Brighter Visions Sustaining Member Club** application (which I believe supercedes the old North Carolina Lions Foundation Club 50 program).

To be eligible for the Brighter Visions Sustaining Member Club, a Lion should raise \$50 or more in one year. Each year in which a Lion raises \$50 or more the amount raised will be added to the cumulative total. Pins are awarded when the total raised reaches or surpasses the following amounts:

\$100, \$250, \$500, \$1,000, \$1,500, \$2,000, \$3,000, \$4,000, \$5,000, \$7,500, \$10,000, \$12,500, \$15,000

And in increments of \$5,000 thereafter.

So if your club turned in \$10,000 in Brighter Visions funds last year, and you had 50 members, you could potentially report every member had raised \$200 each and every member would get a \$100 pin and have \$100 credit toward the next level of \$250, OR you could report ONE member raised \$10,000 and ONE MEMBER would get a \$10,000 pin. Obviously you would have to keep track of this for prior years so that each member would eventually receive the appropriate dollar recognition. I anticipate that as this is a new program, (and to hold the costs down) that only the immediate year would be eligible for the report and request for pins.

I would like to call the Board's attention to the **NCLI Committees Policy and Duties Manual** dated May 20, 2018, Article II, Page 4, Section 8: Fellowships and Partners Committee. The NCLI Ambassador Award is not mentioned in this Policy, the Brighter Visions Sustaining Member Club is not mentioned in Article II, Page 3, Section 5: Brighter

Visions Annual Fund Drive (which does include a mention of Memorials and Honorarys). Perhaps the Board would consider asking the BYLAWS Committee to review and make recommendations about these potential deficiencies.

Section 5: BRIGHTER VISIONS ANNUAL FUND DRIVE

The duties of this Committee shall be to promote North Carolina Lions, Incorporated fund raising projects approved by the Board of Directors, the State Council of Governors, and the Lions of North Carolina in compliance with the existing state legislation. Funds collected from such drives, including Lions Clubs' contributions, shall be remitted to the state office of the North Carolina Lions, Incorporated which shall keep an accurate record of such funds. Monies shall be deposited in an approved bank to the credit of the North Carolina Lions, Incorporated.

This Committee shall promote North Carolina Lions, Incorporated fund raising projects through the use of Memorials and Honorariums. The duties of this committee shall include educating the local clubs regarding this program, promoting the use of Memorials and Honorariums by the general public, preparing informational brochures and materials for use of Lions and conducting programs. This Committee should use all available means to promote Memorials and Honorariums such as district newsletters, North Carolina Lions, Incorporated newsletters and press releases.

Section 8: FELLOWSHIPS AND PARTNERS COMMITTEE

This Committee shall promote the memories and accomplishments of Past International Presidents John L. "Jack" Stickley, William L. Woolard, and Sid L. Scruggs, III to the Lions of North Carolina through established programs.

This Committee shall promote the use of the Jack Stickley Fellowship as an endowment fund to assist in covering North Carolina Lions, Incorporated administrative expenses

This Committee shall also promote the use of the William L. Woolard Partner-In-Service program not only to fund an endowment but also to provide funding for current programs and services

This Committee shall promote the use of the Sid L. Scruggs, III Beacon of Hope Fellowship to provide funding to support campers attending Camp Dogwood Summer Program for the visually impaired.



JACK STICKLEY FELLOWSHIP

The Jack Stickley Fellowship has been created to honor the memory of North Carolina's first President of Lions Clubs International.

The Fellowship is available to everyone. Lion and Non-Lion alike may become a Jack Stickley Fellow. The Fellowship is available to Lions Clubs and Lioness Clubs, as well as individuals. It may also be given as a Memorial.

The Fellowship may be obtained for a contribution of \$500.00 or more. The contribution may be made over a period of time by making payments of not less than \$100.00. The Fellowship will be prepared and given upon receipt of the final payment.

No Humanitarian/White Cane credit will be given for Fellowship contributions.

All Fellowship funds will be placed in an endowment fund with the interest going into the North Carolina Lions, Incorporated general operating fund.

The long term goal is to acquire enough funds in the Fellowship Endowment for the interest earned to pay the NC Lions administrative costs. This will permit every dollar raised for Humanitarian/White Cane funds to be expended for services to the NC Lions clients.

The recipient of the Jack Stickley Fellowship will receive a letter from the North Carolina Lions, Incorporated President, a Personalized Plaque, a Stickley Fellow Pin, and a numbered Wallet ID Card. The plaque will also have a number on the back for record keeping purposes.

At meetings, Stickley Fellows may be honored.

Introduction

I would like to thank President Chris Headley for asking me to serve as state chairperson for the 2019-2020 Brighter Visions Campaign. It's been 13 years since the last time that I served as state chairperson for this committee; although it was named Humanitarian/White Cane back then. In 2006-2007, the year that I served as chairperson, Multiple District 31 surpassed our statewide goal, so I am hoping that we can do it again this year. In fact, I know we can as long as we get total participation among our state's clubs.

Brighter Visions 2018-2019 Review

As of June 30 financial report, \$527,167 was raised for the 2018-2019 campaign, which was short of our statewide goal of \$600,860. I would like to congratulate the clubs and leadership in District 31-I and District 31-O, as both districts surpassed their respective Brighter Visions' goals. I also would like to congratulate Past District Governor Laurine Dupree, last year's state chairperson who spent countless hours traveling around the multiple district as head of last year's campaign. She was also very helpful to me in preparing for this year's campaign.

The multiple district did good last year as approximately 87-percent of clubs made a contribution to Brighter Visions. Laurine and I believe that declining membership in North Carolina had a definite impact on the campaign. According to the financial report, 145 clubs gave less money to the campaign in 2018-2019 than the previous year. Had those clubs just contributed the same amount as in 2017-2018, we would have raised an extra \$147,352. We would have surpassed our statewide goal by more than \$73,000.

The 2019-2020 Brighter Visions Campaign

District governors have set a minimum statewide goal of \$583,560 for this year's campaign. It is an attainable financial goal for the multiple district. In fact, I think we can surpass the goal. Two district governors even increased their Brighter Visions goal this year.

Myself, along with the district committee chairpersons and the staff of North Carolina Lions, Inc., will be working hard this year to educate our state's membership on why we must have 100-percent support among clubs and our members for the campaign. Money raised through Brighter Visions makes up 49.2-percent of the NCLI budget, with a large percentage of that money going toward support the operational cost of Camp Dogwood. It also supports our matching funds program, the mobile screening unit, mobility and support canes, health education programs, organ and tissue procurement and our state's recycling program.

Part of that educational process is the publishing of six newsletters, advertisements, and six fact sheets on different programs or services supported by Brighter Visions money. The first newsletter was published in July. I have asked district governors to include the publications in their respective district newsletters. We're also utilizing mass emails to more than 4,000 people across the state that includes a link to the Brighter Visions section on the NCLI website, where they can view and download copies of the newsletters and fact sheets.

In addition to meeting or surpassing our statewide goal, one of my personal goals for the Brighter Visions Committee is that we attain 100-percent participation by clubs in the multiple district. Last year, we had 57 active Lions clubs that did not contribute one dollar to the campaign.

I have asked my district chairpersons to work with these "zero" clubs to make sure that they understand why we need to financially support NCLI. Even if these clubs cannot meet their district governor's minimum per member goal for Brighter Visions; they should still contribute something to the campaign. Every dollar raised helps—a \$50 contribution from a club or club member can buy a mobility cane.

Next week we will start our Brighter Visions kickoffs. Along with myself and NCLI staff members, President Chris Headley, and Camp Dogwood State Chairpersons Marti Henry and Wayne Faber will be attending the meetings.

More than 6,000 people were served by NCLI in 2018-2019 with a total of 92 counties in North Carolina receiving some benefit from the Brighter Visions Campaign. Our state's charitable organization deserves the support of our clubs and members.
