Wishing all Lions Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. Our first half of the Lions year had its ups and downs with Brighter Visions state wide when looking at the previous year. As of December 15, 2023, we are at \$261,008 and last year same date was at \$218,927. In comparison that looks great so keep up the good work. BV Leaders to-date, 31-L Hendersonville and Etowah, 31-I, Linwood and Salisbury, 31-O, Sanford and Durham, 31-N, Western Harnett and Kenansville, 31-S Raleigh Host and Lake Gaston. Camp Dogwood Raffle as of December 15 is \$17,119. The previous year to date was at \$20,839, not bad, usually picks up as the conventions begin. Camp Dogwood raffle leaders are: 31-L, Lake Lure, 31-I, Bethlehem, 31-O, Siler City, 31-N, Kinston, 31-S, Lake Gaston and Apex.

Our biggest unknown is the Memorials and Honorariums program that you can memorialize loved ones, friends, that special person or honor Lions and friends. We can mail you forms or will take the information over the phone and bill by credit card. We can also provide your club with a stand and forms that can be placed at funeral homes. You can stamp your club name on the form. When mailing be sure to write in your club name and it will be credited to your club's BV Fund Drive. Churches, civic groups, service groups and most other nonprofits are very successful with this program and NCLF has been in the past.

You have District Chairs that can come to your club and present any of our Programs and Services. That's how you inform your new and potential members.
